#### **Basic outline**

## Shine Relief Flood Relief Strategy

Shine Relief Flood Relief Strategy is informed by our charitable objects which provide the framework for the delivery of any relief work within the community. As Shine Relief regularly supports vulnerable children in two project areas within the community and at 2 boarding schools it needs to ensure the safety of these children as a priority. Staff and volunteers connected with our project are also a priority for relief. Vulnerable children without care or in a child care-giver situation identified by local leaders and the DC Office would be our next priority followed by children with extremely vulnerable care givers. Support needed is agreed after consultation with the DC Office, Chief Kuntumanji and Social Welfare/Disaster management co-ordinator.

## Criteria Identified

Victims of disaster i.e. Flooding, storms and subsequent disease and health issues. Displaced families, Child-headed are a priority and those connected to Shine Relief Project

## Aims

To distribute relief items to the most needy through Village Heads Leaders in accordance with recommendations by the DC Office and through identified partners in accordance with Shine Relief's Board Strategic Plan.

#### Need Identified

Food, shelter, warmth, protection from malaria DC Office Response Plan Zomba Shine assessed the homes in Chilambe area

## Relief phases Identified

- provide funds to bring aid to flood victims in Zomba District Malawi in particular vulnerable families supported by Shine Relief Trust and/or AOG church members in Zomba, whose homes have been destroyed/damaged by providing emergency support to those who have been made homeless providing food, plates, blankets, plastic sheeting / repairs needed for shelter.
- provide house repairs for child-headed families, staff and volunteers connected with Shine Reliefs Project and also if sufficient funds are available to vulnerable families as identified by the District Commissioner's Office Zomba in Zomba District who are without a home.

(The fund could be divided into 3 areas -DC Office victims, TA Kuntumanji Village Heads victims, AOG Zomba Church victims,) Flood Relief objectives should be outlined and agreed by the Malawi board. An agreed amount given to purchase relief through

## **Identifying needs**

The councillor, the Chiefs and the relief officer helped in the process of identifying the affected people.

#### Finance

On 20th January 2015 643,000.00 MKW was paid into the 2015 Flood Relief fund and there was an addition of 200,000.00 MK from New Zealand which came to a total of 800,000.00 MK.

A further two sums 467,347.50 and 377,559.00 were later received to be used for Phase 2 .

#### **Distribution and Use of funds**

#### • Shine Local Flood Relief programme

Shine was informed by the DC Office CHF were at risk in Shines area (Chilambe) and around Kuntumanji.

Funds amounting to 500,000 MKW were allocated for the provision of aid to the most vulnerable Child headed families around Kuntumanji. Items were distributed in various packs depending on need and resource available.

## **Outcomes**

#### **Shine Programme outcome**

50 families were reached and assisted with items such as food and shelter, since government and other agencies were concentrating on assisting people who were accommodated in the camps that were set aside by government as compared to shine who reached out to people who were accommodated in the shelters that were organised by the villagers themselves for example the outdoor kitchens.
